Overview for Facilitators:

Speaker Notes

Materials Required for face to face

1. Share the outline with timelines for the training (build in breaks)
2. Conduct an opening activity (introductions/ice breaker)
3. Computers or tablets with internet access for participants (if possible)
4. Handouts
5. Projector with audio capable for playing video with speakers
6. Presentation slides with speaker notes
7. Develop an evaluation tool for all attendees (e.g., continuous improvement activity)

Materials Required for virtual

1. Distribute the link to the online platform in advance
2. Share the outline with timelines for the training (build in breaks)
3. Conduct an opening activity (introductions/ice breaker)
4. Determine how participants will receive handouts and materials, on the cloud, using a storage platform (e.g., dropbox, google, etc.)
5. Platform to share presentation (e.g., zoom, teams, etc.) with polling questions prepared in advance and breakout room capability
6. Upload or send handouts in advance or through platform (insert through chat)
7. Download videos ahead of time to prepare for low bandwidth from slide deck
8. Share screen capability (be sure to enable sound for videos)

9. Develop an evaluation tool for all attendees (e.g., continuous improvement activity)

Being with people who understand your daily struggles and others can offer wisdom from experience. DEC Communities of Practice are a great way to start making connections in the field.</p>

<p>Slide 9</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Develops Leadership Skills</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• When you belong to a professional organization, you have opportunities to develop leadership skills within the EI/ECSE profession. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Participate in local, regional, and national activities</li> <li>• Contribute by being on boards or workgroups</li> <li>• Join advocacy efforts to influence policy changes</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <hr/> 	<p>A professional organization can help you develop leadership skills as it provides opportunities to join local, regional and national activities and be a part of boards or workgroups which allows you to learn from others and contribute to the field. You can take on additional roles outside of the classroom to build your resume and work experience.</p>

You can be a leader or have leadership qualities even though you do not manage anyone.</p> <p>How can you build your leadership qualities and attributes?</p>
<p>Slide 11</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Connects you to Policy and Advocacy Opportunities</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Children’s Action Network (CAN)</li> <li>• Advocacy Letters</li> <li>• Policy and Advocacy Committee</li> <li>• Policy and Advocacy Resources</li> </ul> <hr/> 	<p>DEC offers several ways to engage in policy and advocacy activities;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Children’s Action Network is a communication network that works toward changes at the local, state and federal level. -Through DEC state subdivision the CAN network engages members to take action on issues important to the field.</li> <li>• Joining a listserv will alert you to current policy and advocacy issues and provide opportunities to contribute or get involved,</li> <li>• you can write letters to your legislators; the organization provides templates based on the issue.</li> <li>• You can join the community of practice policy and advocacy committee, there are many resources you can access on the DEC website.</li> </ul>
